The successful applicants will work within the T&G national organising department under the direction of the head of the organising department, the deputy general secretary.

Project worker - Leading the T&G migrant workers support unit

An understanding of legal implications surrounding migrant workers, an extensive experience in working for an organisation supporting migrants together with demonstrable experience of building and developing contacts with migrant support organisations is essential for this post.

Applicants should be legally qualified to give full migration advice, have demonstrable knowledge of employment law, and knowledge of current issues surrounding immigration policy, particularly in the workplace and experience of campaigning around these issues.

The salary for this post is £37,000 per annum inclusive of London weighting.

Support worker - Supporting the work of the T&G migrant workers support unit

Experience and a background in migration issues and working directly with migrants is essential for this post.

Applicants should have an awareness of current issues surrounding immigration policy, some knowledge of immigration and employment law and the ability to communicate with people from a variety of backgrounds.

The salary for this post is £23,000 per annum inclusive of London weighting.

Applicants should be aware that due to the nature of both roles, there will be a requirement to travel around the country and on occasions to work unsocial hours.
